Summer 2022 Foreign Language and Areas Studies (FLAS) Fellowships Deadline: February 15, 2022

Learn how to apply for a <u>Foreign Language and Area Studies (FLAS)</u> Fellowship to study a language in the U.S. or abroad during Summer 2022. Fellowships are available for undergraduate and graduate students. Summer FLAS Fellowships provide \$5,000 for program tuition and fees and a \$2,500 living stipend

Priority languages include Arabic, Chinese, Hebrew, Hindi, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Persian/Farsi, Portuguese, Russian, and Swahili. Funding for French, German, and Spanish languages may be available for GRADUATE students at an ADVANCED level ONLY.


Peter Martin joins us for a discussion on his book, "China's Civilian Army: The Making of Wolf Warrior Diplomacy," which charts China's transformation from an isolated and impoverished

communist state to a global superpower from the perspective of those on the front line: China's diplomats.

Peter Martin is Bloomberg's defense policy and intelligence reporter in Washington, DC and author of "China's Civilian Army: The Making of Wolf Warrior Diplomacy." He was previously based in Beijing where he wrote extensively on escalating tensions in the US-China relationship and reported from China's border with North Korea and its far-western region of Xinjiang. His writing has been published by outlets including Foreign Affairs, The Atlantic, Foreign Policy, the National Interest, and the Guardian. He holds degrees from the University of Oxford, Peking University and the London School of Economics.

Peter Martin will discuss his new book with Maria Repnikova, an expert on Chinese political communication and Assistant Professor of Global Communication at Georgia State University.



Deadline: February 15th



FLAS Fellow Spotlight: Kyra Parks

Kyra Parks is finishing her first year in the Master of Public Health Program at GSU with a concentration in environmental epidemiology. She received an Academic Year FLAS Fellowship to study Swahili. We interviewed Kyra about her fellowship.

Why is studying foreign languages important to you?

Studying foreign languages is important to me because it is so much more than just words, it is a window into other cultures. It helps break down barriers between people when you are able to communicate in someone's native language. Foreign languages are especially important in public health. Knowing a foreign language helps public health practitioners create culturally competent messaging and build trust among their target audience.

Why did you choose Swahili?

I chose to study Swahili because it will have a profound impact in my future career in global health in the region of Africa where millions of people speak Swahili. I also enjoy learning about the structure of the language, which is different from other languages I have studied, and the culture of Swahili speakers.

What are your career plans?

I hope to work in global health as an epidemiologist to investigate chronic disease trends. I hope to combine the skills I learn in the GSU MPH program and my Swahili language skills to create educational campaigns that will educate people about how they can prevent and manage chronic disease.

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What kind of impact has the FL fellowship had on you?



I began studying Swahili in high school, but it was difficult to find opportunities to study Swahili and engage with other students in a formal setting since it is not a commonly taught language. FLAS has given me the opportunity to engage with other language learners and build relationships while working towards proficiency in the language. I have also been able to meet other students passionate about language learning through my cohort of FLAS fellows.

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In addition to your FLAS fellowship, have you engaged in other programs offered through the Atlanta Global Studies Center?

I have attended several events hosted by the Atlanta Global Studies Center. I particularly enjoyed the dialogue with Ambassador of Brazil to the United

States Nestor Forster, Jr. hosted by AGSC. This event featured a discussion about strategies to strengthen relations between Atlanta and Brazil. I enjoyed this event because it was thought provoking and the strategies I learned about at this event can be applied to my career in global health to help build relationships with people in other countries.

What advice would you like to give to students interested in applying for a FLAS Fellowship?

I would advise students passionate about language learning and global studies to apply because you never know where your language learning journey will take you! I would encourage applicants to reflect on why they are passionate about foreign language and how it will allow them to have an impact in their future career to develop a competitive application.

Applications for the Thomas Jefferson Fund are open until February 24, 2022 **Subscribe**

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French and American researchers and tosters forward-looking collaborative research that addresses the most pressing global challenges. Proposals must be jointly submitted by one American researcher and one French researcher. "Young" researchers are defined as having fifteen or fewer years of experience.

Applications are accepted in the three following fields:

- Humanities and Social Sciences (HSS)
- Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM)
- Science for Society (interdisciplinary STEM-HSS projects)

Selected projects will receive funding up to \$20,000, to be shared equally between the French and American partners over 2 years. These funds support transatlantic mobility of researchers, collaborative research activities, the organization of international workshops or conferences, and the publication of joint articles.

This program is a key tool for joint French-American research projects. Thomas Jefferson Fund encourages the applications of qualified researchers from all institutions and backgrounds. The Fund aims for a selection rate of at least 25%; since 2017, 102 projects have been funded.
