

The Atlanta Global Research and Education Collaborative (AGREC), coordinated by AGSC, invites scholars to submit collaborative project proposals across disciplines and institutions that address global issues at the local level.

AGREC is now comprised of seven universities including Emory, Georgia Tech, GSU, Agnes Scott, Spelman, KSU, and Clark Atlanta University. Teams from at least two member institutions may apply for **funding in the range of \$5,000 - \$20,000**, to be expended by August 2025.

On Friday, April 12th, AGSC held its signature annual event, the Atlanta Global Studies Symposium. This year's Symposium featured four exciting sessions:

- "Impacts of Climate Change and Adaptation in the Global South"
- "Migration, Community Associations, and Sustainability"
- "Adapting Public Health and Science in Atlanta's Global Communities"
- "Language Education and Peacebuilding"

These were followed by a thrilling keynote lecture and live performance by **GRAMMY® awardwinning musician David Sánchez**, who illustrated the rich cultural heritage of the rhythms of the Afro Caribbean embodied in a musical language shaped by resistance, survival, and the search for sustainability.

This talk on March 6 had Kat Mustatea, one of the finalists for the Guthman Musical Instrument Competition, present her work and her new musical instrument "BodyMouth". It is a soundmovement instrument that makes use of real-time speech synthesis in live performance to enable speaking through physical movement. Wearing sensors on their body, a performer sounds out words, phoneme by phoneme, by enacting specific gestures in sequence—literally, turning the body into a mouth that speaks!

Student Opportunities

Federal Scholarship and Internship Opportunities

Fulbright: Provides grants to graduating college seniors, graduate students, young professionals, and artists to pursue graduate or professional studies, conduct research, or teach English abroad for up to one academic year. <u>https://us.fulbrightonline.org/</u>. Application Opens: April 2024.

Virtual Student Federal Service (VSFS): Part-time, virtual internships with flexible schedules. Interns can partner with Department of State diplomatic posts overseas and domestic offices, as well as other agencies. All VSFS interns are unpaid and volunteer ten hours a week from September to May. <u>https://vsfs.state.gov</u>. Next deadline: January 2025.

Critical Language Scholarship (CLS): Offers opportunities for undergraduate and graduate students in U.S.- based degree programs to learn one of 15 languages through immersive study abroad institutes each summer. <u>https://clscholarship.org/</u>. Next Application Deadline: November 2024.

U.S. Department of State Student Internship Program: Paid internships offered during the fall, spring, and summer semesters in Washington, D.C. and at U.S. embassies and consulates overseas. Interns will receive GS-04 pay level, including transportation/housing expenses. Applicants must have completed at least 60 credit hours at an accredited university at the start of the internship, have at least a 3.2 GPA, and be enrolled in school the semester immediately following the internship. <u>https://careers.state.gov/interns-fellows/student-internship-program/</u>. Vacancies are on a rolling basis.

U.S. Foreign Service Internship Program (USFSIP): *Merit and needs-based opportunity* available to undergraduate sophomore and junior students with a 3.2 GPA or higher. The program provides two paid internships in consecutive summers. The first will be in Washington, D.C. and the second one will be at a U.S. Embassy or Consulate abroad. Interns will receive pay at the GS-04 level and transportation/housing expenses. *https://careers.state.gov/interns-fellows/student-internship-program/. Vacancies are on a rolling basis.*

Pathways Internship Program: Offers paid employment for students while they attend school. Applicants must be at least 16 years old and enrolled or accepted as a student (full-time or part-time) in a qualifying high school, vocational school, undergraduate or graduate



Colin Powell Leadership Program Internship: The Colin Powell Leadership Program recruits highly motivated individuals from a variety of backgrounds who aspire to and possess the potential to become future Civil Service leaders in the Department. The program provides paid internships to students who are enrolled at accredited institutions of higher education. <u>https://bit.ly/3wFEYgh</u>. Vacancies are on a rolling basis.
